



When Mrs. Honious decided to move to the Intermediate and Middle School, I was thrilled to be selected as the new Library Media Specialist at KES. My name is Liz Murphy and I have been an educator for about 18 years, most recently as a kindergarten teacher in New London. It has been my pleasure to welcome students back into the library after so many months away. Over the course of the month of September, each class wrote two class books--Some Things You Should Know About Us and Our Class's Favorite Things--as we

all got to know each other. I have done by best to learn more than 200 names as quickly as possible! Each grade is currently learning or re-learning the process of taking a book out of the library, as well as how to care for these books. In addition, kindergarten and first grade have been working on rhyming and identifying important aspects of a book and story (author, illustrator, characters, etc.). Second and third grades have been reviewing different genres of books as we prepare to learn more about how libraries are organized; they are also learning to select "just right" books that will challenge, but not frustrate, them as readers. Since many students have been away from the library for so long, it may help to establish some routines, such as choosing a special and safe place for library books to live in your home and marking each child's library day on a calendar. Not sure what those days are? Check out the table on the library website, which can be accessed from KES's website. There's also a link on the library website to our Goodreads page, which I will update frequently to reflect what books each grade has read. Coming up in October: on the 27th our third graders will have a virtual visit with award-winning author Katherine Applegate. Until next month, happy reading!

During social studies, students will engage in the study of our local government and the various roles and responsibilities that are needed to make a community thrive.
